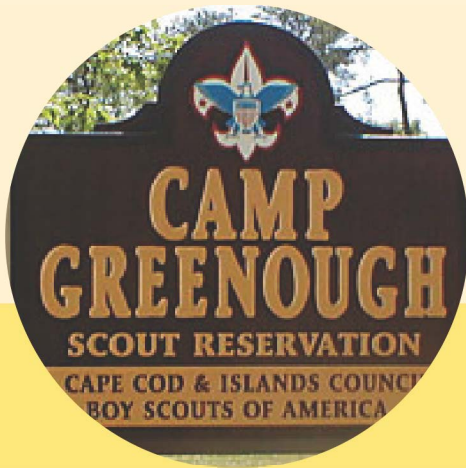

## WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

- Completed medical form and certificate of immunization must be submitted 1 week prior to your arrival at camp.
- Comfortable footwear with socks— No open-toed shoes or sandals. We recommend water shoes for swimtime.
- Swim suit and towel—or, wear suit dry to camp and change just once
- Sunblock—SPF 15 or higher
- Wear a hat
- Water bottle (full) - can be refilled as needed
- Insect repellent—No aerosol cans please
- Poncho (rain gear)

## WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP

## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Five full days in the great outdoors are packed with activity and FUN! at Camp Greenough. A small amount of preparation in advance will help ensure an exciting and enjoyable Scouting experience. There are a few things parents should remember to help their children get the most out of summer camp.

- Arrive on time. Program begins at 9:00 AM and ends at 4:00 PM. Late arrivals will be accommodated as best as possible.
- Extended Hours for early drop-off and/or late pick-up are available (8:00 AM to 5:00 PM) and must be pre-arranged with the camp Program Director. An additional fee of \$50 per week applies.
- Wood and Deer Ticks are present throughout the camp. Protect your child by taking appropriate precautions including a thorough body inspection when you get home. Consult your physician before using DEET-based repellants.
- Refrigeration—Lunch will be provided. If instead, you choose to send a lunch. It must be nutritious and kept in the camper's backpack to avoid contact with other camper belongings. Campers will not have access to refrigeration or microwaves.
- Your Camper will go swimming 3 days a week unless there are thunderstorms. Plan for clothing they can easily change in and out of.
- First Aid treatment of minor injuries will be handled by camp staff. Parents will be called immediately in the event of serious injury or if transport to a medical facility is necessary. Be sure we have proper contact numbers.
- Parents, your child will finish the day tired and dirty. Please do not send them with new clothes.

## COMPLETED MEDICAL FORMS AND CERTIFICATE OF IMMUNIZATIONS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL PARTICIPATING YOUTH, ADULTS, AND STAFF.

Participation requirements for summer camps, include completion of a BSA Annual Health History and a certificate of immunization from the doctor are required by the health department. All immunizations must be up to date. No camper will be permitted to stay at camp without proof of immunizations and completed medical form. Participants must complete Parts A and B of the medical history form. Please submit forms to the council office prior to your registered week. Fax forms to 508-362-4323

Any and all camper medications must be presented to the camp staff, in the original container, labeled with the camper's name and any doctor's instructions for administration. Campers may keep only inhalers and epipens with them (for asthma and allergies).

- Campers will have the opportunity to visit the trading post throughout the week.
- Items range from 50 cents to \$20.



### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Camper drop-off and pick-up is in the camp parking lot. Please, for the protection of all the campers and staff, do not pass the main parking area.
- Bullying and aggressive behavior will not be tolerated. Parents will be notified if there are issues that need to be addressed.
- For your child's safety, campers will not be allowed to leave camp with anyone other than you, unless you provide, in advance, a completed and signed Authorization to Release Day Camper.

- Hand sanitizer will be available for campers and staff as needed.
- All campers must be picked up on time. Failure to pick up your camper on time will first result in phone calls to all emergency contacts requesting immediate pick up. If the problem persists and alternate pick up arrangements cannot be made, camp attendance may be forfeited.
- All first grade campers (Tiger Cubs) must be accompanied by an adult who has submitted all proper medical forms in advance.
- Staff and campers practice kindness to all creatures. Review the code of conduct.
- The Camp Greenough phone (508-362-3428) may not always be attended as the staff is busy providing daily program for your child. In the event of an emergency, parents may call the Council Service Center (508-362-4322).
- Parents have the right to background check, health care, and discipline policies as well as procedures for filing grievances.
- No child will be denied food or drinks as a form of punishment as in accordance with state guidelines.
- Please send water shoes with your child's daily items. This will keep their feet safe when walking to and from swimming.
- Avoid sending nut products with your camper, many children have allergies.
